

A note from Bruce, and a Calvin grad...

Sam Cummins is a "Calvin kid." Even though he not a kid anymore, like hundreds of others, he will always be a Calvin kid.

I met him in my choir classroom at Portersville Christian School back in the later 90's. He was the youngest of three brothers, all very active at the school and in the musical activities that I was leading there. Their growing friendship with me was a wonderful discovery and gift, because I had worked with both of their parents (Bob & Robin) on staff together at nearby Pine Valley Camp back when we were in high school and college.

Sam became very connected with the Calvin youth program in his high school years, and eventually became one of our numerous collegians who worked at least one entire summer on the staff of Camp Westminster on Higgins Lake in Michigan. And we were all blessed by his magnificent effortless tenor voice which contributed often to Calvin



life. He became a certified medical technician, working locally until he moved to the Chicago area several years ago with his wife Claudia.

Less than a year ago, baby Aria arrived, and as you may recall, she was almost immediately diagnosed with cancer. Since then, much progress has occurred, and much progress remains, but through the divine combination of God's grace, connected prayers, and medical expertise the family prevails, although COVID has added many complications.

You may or may not know much about the Covid safety practices at our neighbor churches, but we are amazingly "CHI blessed at Calvin to have so many medical professionals within our church, several of whom now advise us as the Calvin Covid Task Force (CCTF). They wave been unwavering in their sharing of actual medical & research truth, which often flies in the face of much popular but grossly inaccurate opinion.

Last week, Sam and his wife had yet another medical appointment with baby Aria. And as Sam sat in his car, he wrote the following missive: Like a Biblical prophet, the words sting and lament, they implore and hope, and are Spirit-directed to teach us something.

Well everyone I hope you are happy. Every one of you who refuses to wear a mask and not social distance you are guilty. Each person that has allowed this virus to spread unchecked due to your personal selfishness is having an impact on others.

My daughter was born on March 31st 2020 in the middle of COVID lockdown starting.

Masks were mandatory. No family or friends were allowed at the birth or after. Just her Dad and Mom present from her beginning. She had low blood sugar her first night which resulted in a week stay in the NICU. Only one parent at a time could be with her that first week. She balanced everything out and appeared completely normal. We went home by ourselves with our new baby at the end of the first week.

A week later was the first pediatrician appointment and again only one parent permitted to attend.

At one month old she had her second pediatrician appointment and again only one parent permitted to attend.

At six weeks old my daughter had a decreased appetite, distended abdomen, and some vomiting. We took her to a children's hospital and yet again only one parent allowed in the emergency room. She was admitted and we received an exception to have us both with our daughter while she was in the hospital. We were together when a computer screen with an Oncologist on it was wheeled into the hospital room. We were told through a computer that our 6 week old daughter had cancer throughout her liver and chemo needed to be started as soon as possible.

We have been through 4 rounds of chemotherapy, picc line appointments, cat scans, ultrasounds, MIBG testing and many doctor visits. Feeding tubes, IM injections, picc line flushes, all with a tiny baby.

Her mother and I have done as much as we can of this together. We have both continued working our full time jobs with masks on and distancing as much as possible from others.

Today as we arrived at the hospital for a follow up. A hospital where we have always been able to be together for appointments. Staff stopped us at the lobby and said new policy states only one parent allowed for the appointment.

So to sum things up. I am not allowed to be with my daughter this morning while she gets blood drawn, an ultrasound, and meets with her doctor. I am not allowed to help comfort my daughter who only knows a handful of people while she has her procedures done. I am not allowed to be supportive of my wife while this all happens. I'm not even allowed to sit in the lobby and wait for them to come down stairs. Security directed me to return to my car and wait. Explaining well it's the hospitals policy and to blame COVID.

I am writing this in the car, sitting here waiting for news of the appointment and how it is going. Not being with my daughter and wife this morning I do not blame on COVID at all.

I blame each and every one of you who refuse to were a mask in public. I blame each and every one of you who post about your liberties and freedoms. (Children of God are only guarantied freedom from the consequences of sin) I blame each and every one of you who refuse to limit your gatherings.

I have worked in healthcare for almost 20 years now. I have seen a lot of suffering and loss. This past year has been difficult but not impossible to overcome. Please do your part and limit the spread of this disease. Others are counting on you so they can have hope, and time with those they love. Again I've witnessed many people die and suffer over the years. I implore you to stop contributing to the spread of this disease to others through your own selfishness and ignorance.

UPDATE ON ARIA ON JANUARY 5TH

Aria is doing well. Cancer seems to be being held at bay by her immune system right now so no chemo. Won't have another follow up till three months from now unless symptoms emerge. Claudia and I are tired but finding escape by still working as much as possible and taking turns with Aria. She is nine months old now and hitting every milestone so far even with everything else. That post was all about venting and frustration for me. I feel like I have so much to share about experiences and Gods Providence over the last couple years.

Mission Matters

Agroforesty Program in northern Ghana

The Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP) awarded this year to the Evangelical Presbyterian Development and Relief Agency in Ghana (EPDRA) another grant to extend the current agroforestry program to an additional three towns, and training for grafting fruit trees to two more schools. EPDRA also expects that matching funds for the agroforestry program will be renewed. Twelve towns and eight middle schools will now benefit from on-site learning. This agroforestry technique is expected to increase the yield of soybeans by 15%, and the yield of corn by 25%. Additionally, EPDRA plans to graft 80 mango trees and plant them near eight middle schools. The fruit harvested annually will benefit these schools in northern Ghana.






